

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) OHBM Educational Courses, Symposia, and Roundtables

Q: Is there any reimbursement for speakers and organizers for programs?

A: The Council has approved the following guidelines related to reimbursement. Organizers should make these policies clear to prospective presenters:

- Educational Course Speakers: Presenters and organizers receive gratis Education Course registration and 50% off Annual Meeting registration. Travel and lodging reimbursement is not provided.
- Symposium and Roundtable Speakers: Presenters/organizers do not receive reimbursement.

Q: Should I submit a proposal for an Educational Course, Symposium or Roundtable?

A: The session types serve different goals:

- Educational Courses aim to provide comprehensive instruction on a topic, covering established methods, recent applications, and practical guidance for attendees' research. Courses must include audience engagement (e.g., interactive polls, gamification, social media activities, collaborative notes).
- **Symposiums** aim to present the most recent advances in a topic of general scientific interest.
- **Roundtables** are best suited for non-scientific topics, such as initiatives emerging from Special Interest Groups (SIGs) or committees.

Q: What are the format differences between the different session types?

A:

- Educational Courses: Held on the first day (June 14, 2026). Half-day courses include up to 6 presenters (approx. 3½–4 hours); full-day courses include up to 10 presenters (approx. 7–8 hours).
- Symposia and Roundtables: 75-minute sessions during the main meeting (June 15–18, 2026), with a maximum of four presenters.

Q: Is a Full-Day Educational Course more desirable or prestigious than a Half-Day Course?

A: No. The length of the course does not determine its merit or impact. A well-designed, interactive Half-Day Course can be more effective than a poorly-organized Full-Day Course. Full-Day Courses are best for core methods and applications relevant to the broader OHBM community, but the key goal is always to deliver a well-run, engaging, and educational experience.

Q: Can I submit more than one proposal for an Educational Course or Symposia?

A: No. Individuals may submit one scientific program (Symposium or Roundtable) and one Educational Course, but the same content may not be presented in both. Multiple proposals from the same



individual will not be accepted. Educational Courses should be didactic, structured, and instructional, not mini-symposia or repeated material from elsewhere in the meeting.

Q: When will the proposal review take place?

A:

- **Educational Courses:** Reviewed by the OHBM Education Committee in December 2025; final decisions in January 2026.
- **Symposia, Roundtables, and Oral Sessions:** Reviewed by the Program Committee throughout January 2026; final decisions in early-February 2026.

Decisions are final and will be sent via email within two weeks of selection.
